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REPORT OF GUEST LECTURE ON PHARMACOVIGILANCE, CLINICAL RESEARCH & CLINICAL DATA MANAGEMENT

INTRODUCTION

A guest lecture on **Pharmacovigilance, Clinical Research, and Clinical Data Management** was organized by AIMS College of Pharmacy on **7th July 2025** for B.Pharm Third Year and D.Pharm Second Year students. The session aimed to educate students about emerging career opportunities in the field of drug safety and clinical trials. The guest speaker, **Mr. Shaik Eliyas**, Team Leader at Life Line Training, delivered a highly insightful presentation, sharing his expertise in various clinical domains and the futuristic scope they offer.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Mr. Shaik Eliyas began the lecture by introducing the concept of Pharmacovigilance—the science related to the detection, assessment, understanding, and prevention of adverse effects or any other drug-related problems. He explained its critical role in ensuring patient safety post-marketing and emphasized the growing demand for trained professionals in this area due to the increasing number of clinical trials and global regulatory requirements.

He then transitioned into the field of Clinical Research, covering its structure, phases of clinical trials, and the responsibilities of clinical research associates (CRAs). He illustrated how India has become a key hub for global clinical trials, creating vast job prospects for pharmacy graduates.

Further, Mr. Eliyas elaborated on Clinical Data Management (CDM)—a vital component in clinical trials responsible for collecting, cleaning, and managing trial data. He outlined the basic tools and software used in the industry (such as Oracle Clinical, Medidata Rave) and discussed the skills required to excel in the CDM domain.

The session was highly interactive, with Mr. Eliyas engaging students through real-world examples, career pathways, industry expectations, and entry-level job roles in each domain. He also encouraged students to consider certification programs and internships to build their profiles for a successful career in clinical research sectors.


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CONCLUSION
